1. Title

7. Freedom – Tell about Ann Maria's life in freedom - where did she go? etc. (as much as you can from information provided)
8. Reward for Ann Maria after her escape.
9. Photo – Ann Maria Weems (from "The Underground Railroad" by William Still)
10. Venn Diagram – On the back of your project do a Venn Diagram comparing your life with the life of Ann Maria when she was your age.


